

RULE CHANGES FROM SEPTEMBER 27, 2007 TO MAY 12, 2008 PROPOSED RULES

606.3.3 SUSPENSION OF ANY [~~AND ALL~~] RULES

In any case wherein the Board deems it necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare, the operation or application of any rule herein may be suspended with or without prior notice.

606.4.2 COMPLIANCE WITH RULES [~~REQUIRED~~]

All Persons who enter on or make use of the Access Permit Zone and Great Sacandaga Lake shall do so in compliance with the rules set forth in this Part. Any violation of these rules shall be subject to enforcement action as set forth in this Part. Any Person violating said rules may, in addition to other enforcement action, be deemed to have interfered with the operation of, or have caused injury to, a regulating reservoir, and be subject to the provisions of the Environmental Conservation Law.

606.5.13 ENFORCEMENT OF RULES [~~REGULATIONS~~] AND PERMITS

The District reserves the right and shall have the authority to compel compliance with the rules set forth in this Part as well as any terms and conditions of Access Permits and Work Permits and shall have the right and authority to enforce any violations thereof. The Executive Director, or his designee, will issue a written notice to a non-complying permit holder identifying the specific details of the violation, the corrective action required and, if a suspension or revocation of the Access Permit is contemplated.

606.5.15 SUSPENSION OF PERMIT

If the District finds a condition that affects the public health, safety or welfare, the Executive Director or his designee may suspend, without hearing and without prior notice, any Permit issued by the District and thereby the Permit Holder's privileges under such Permit until the condition is abated or corrected. The Executive Director, or his designee, will issue a written notice to the permit holder identifying the specific details of the violation and abatement or corrective actions required.

In cases other than those affecting public health, safety and welfare, the Executive Director or his designee [~~must~~] will issue a written notice to the Permit Holder identifying the specific details of the violation. The Permit Holder shall then provide the District with appropriate abatement or correction proposals. Suspension of the Permit is subject to the Appeals Process contained in this Part.
